Witnessing your gift make an impact is one of the most exciting parts of supporting Mackinac Island Community Foundation. In 2021, this impact was felt in one of the most vital areas of need on Mackinac Island: **year-round housing**.

Forest Way Townhomes: Rentals for our Workforce

The first **Forest Way Townhomes** was completed in summer 2020 to house exclusively year-round Island workers. Phase II of Forest Way, made possible through a \$247,728 grant from MICF's **Island Community Needs Fund**, is currently under construction and will double the number of units available for year-round Mackinac Island workers. Nurses, teachers, bank tellers, and transportation workers are just a few of the types of jobs held by Townhome residents, with all renters required to be employed and live 11 months out of the year on Mackinac Island.

Edgewood: Single-Family Forever Homes

Home ownership is another vital piece of the collaborative housing solution developed through a partnership between MICF, the City of Mackinac Island, and Mackinac Island Housing Corporation (MIHC). MIHC, a community land trust, offers an opportunity in the Island's **Edgewood** neighborhood: full-time Island residents own their home, but lease their land. When they choose to sell, the owner will sell to another qualified resident using a resale formula that allows the seller to retain some equity, while also keeping the home affordable for future generations. The Mackinac Island Community Foundation continues to work closely with the Mackinac Island Housing Corporation to develop sustainable housing solutions on Mackinac, with plans for more homes to be built in the near future.
